Their time is so scheduled with activities, homework, and sometimes family that there isn't much time left to let loose. I am amazed at times with the amount of pressure I see these teens going through.

Going into the new school year, as a person who truly thrives off of order, I am challenging myself to figure out how I can give the youth here at church more choice. Letting them pick games and truly listening to what they want and like. As parents there are of course always things your children will not be able to have a choice on, like doing their homework, but I believe we can all find some wiggle room. Maybe we even allow our kids to make the wrong choice to give them the chance to learn how to recover from failure in a safe space. We all want the best for our youth. We want them to grow up to be caring, contributing, faith-filled members of society. So my challenge is that we all take a minute to pause and truly think about the growing pressure our kids are under. Then we make a choice. A choice to hear our youth and give them the freedom to make more decisions and to take the time to guide them in those choices as needed.

My name is Bruce Frogge, and as lead pastor of this community, I want to welcome you to Cypress Creek Christian Church and express how wonderful it is that you have chosen to be here this morning. If you are new, we want to make you feel comfortable in the experience of worship. Feel free to visit the Guest Center in the lobby for information or questions you might have. Here are a few basics that may help your experience:

COMMUNION is a central part of our weekly worship. It is a time when we remember and reenact the Last Supper Jesus had with his disciples. Toward the end of the service, we extend an invitation for everyone who feels called to share together by taking a piece of bread, dipping it in the cup of juice and partaking of the elements. You do not need to be a member of the church to participate. Gluten Free bread is found in the tray on the right hand side of the steps.

OFFERING is accepted every Sunday to support the mission and ministries of the church, though if you are new to Cypress Creek, we simply celebrate your presence and consider that your gift to God this day.

CHILDREN & YOUTH during the 9:30 & 11:00 hours - children (3 years – 5th grade) are in the Youth Building for Christian Education. During the 9:30 hour, Youth (6th – 12th grade) sit in the front rows on the right hand side of the sanctuary. At 11:00 the Youth are in the Youth Building for Christian Education. Please stop by the Guest Center for more information or to have someone walk you over to the Youth Building.

NURSERY is available during all three services for children up to 3 years old. The nursery is found in the Forum building, just outside the main entrance to the Centrum.

Even though I may not know your name today, I prayed for you this morning as I pray every Sunday morning for all who will be joining us for the first time.
